

## Sudden Death.

Samuel J. Nathan, the well-known clothier, went into Gallacher's restaurant this morning about 8:30, ordered a cup of coffee, drank it, called for a morning newspaper and dropped back dead. For several years he had suffered from asthma.

An inquest was held by Justice of the Peace Morris Sommer later in the day, and a verdict of death from natural causes returned. The deceased was 70 years of age and unmarried. He had been in business in Salt Lake for twenty-five years. He had two nephews here who have long been in his employ. They are Abe Martin and Israel Harvey. A brother in New York and a sister in Philadelphia have been notified by wire of Mr. Nathan's sudden and unexpected death.

The deceased was an honored member and past master of Mt. Moriah Lodge in this city. Interment will be in the Jewish cemetery. The time of the funeral has not yet been decided upon.
