

Salt Lake Notes

The condition of Marcena Cannon, driver of the patrol wagon, who was operated on at Holy Cross for peritonitis on Thursday, was at a late hour last night said to be very critical. The hospital authorities said that he might not pull through the night.

Charles Atherton Valentine, who died suddenly yesterday morning at Murray of heart failure, was a member of Mt. Moriah lodge No. 2 F. and A. M. According to his last will and testament the body will be shipped to San Francisco, Cal., for cremation. The matter will be in charge of Christopher Diehl. Mr. Valentine dropped dead on the street at Murray in the forenoon. He was employed in one of the smelters.

There is expected soon the arrival in Salt Lake of an additional judge for the United States Circuit court in the person of the Hon. John A. Riner of Cheyenne. For the next three months he is to assist and substitute for Judge Marshall in the Federal, Circuit and District courts sitting in this city. The coming jurist is a district judge of the United States court for the State of Wyoming and was appointed more than a half score years ago. His transferment here for a temporary period comes per an order from his superior in Federal court at St. Louis.

In the city court yesterday afternoon Robert Shiels and his former brother-in-law, T. B. Smith, were discharged by Judge Tanner on the charge of fighting on State street the night before. This action was taken in both cases at the request of Assistant City Attorney Schulder. Afterwards Shiels tried to have Smith bound over to keep the peace, claiming that he, still feared violence from him. The action was refused him. Smith denied that he had attempted to speak to his divorced wife on the car or to annoy her prior to the alleged assault by his wife's brother and also denied the statement of his former wife that he had been divorced from her because of drinking habits.
