Sheriff Emery's appointment of Wm. Edwards as a deputy was yesterday confirmed by the county commissioners.

A message received from the Provo insane asylum by County Clerk James yesterday announced the death of Oscar T. Lowander at the asylum. He was committed from Salt Lake county a year ago.
